

# **Influenza Vaccine Uptake: Going from 82.9% uptake to less than 55% uptake amongst Healthcare Workers**

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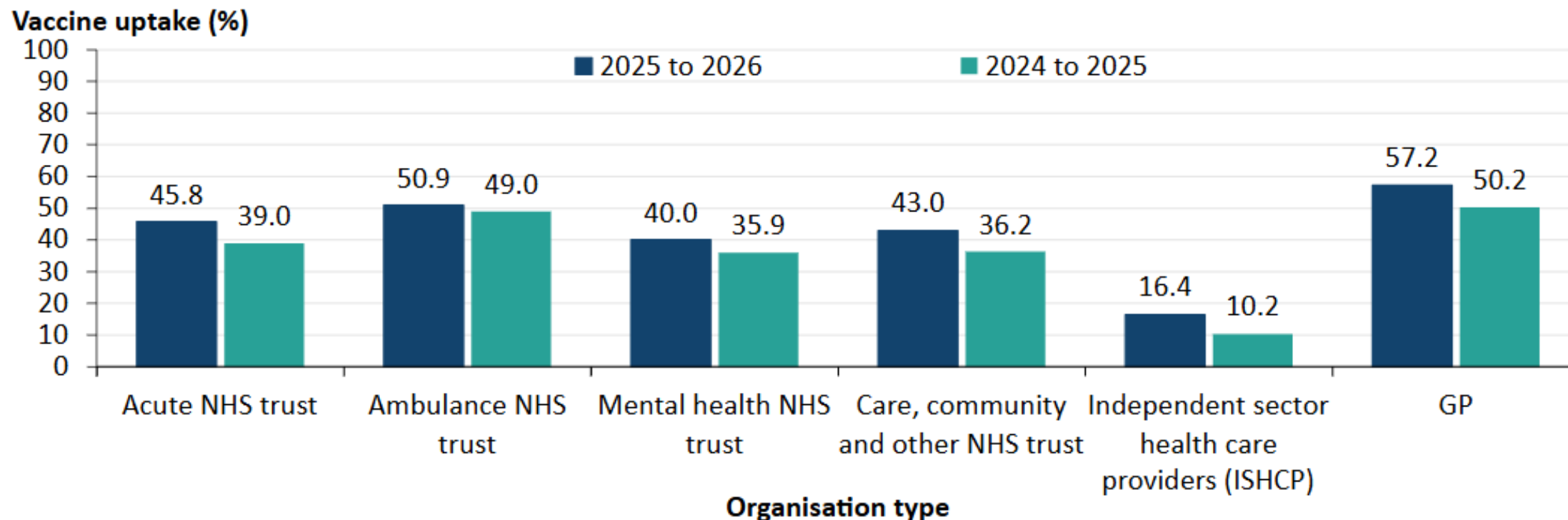

# Flu vaccine uptake in frontline healthcare workers

In both primary and secondary care, a total of 45.4% of all frontline healthcare workers have been vaccinated for influenza in the 2025/26 season compared to 37.8% in 2024/25 and 43.1% in 2023/24 (UKHSA 2026).

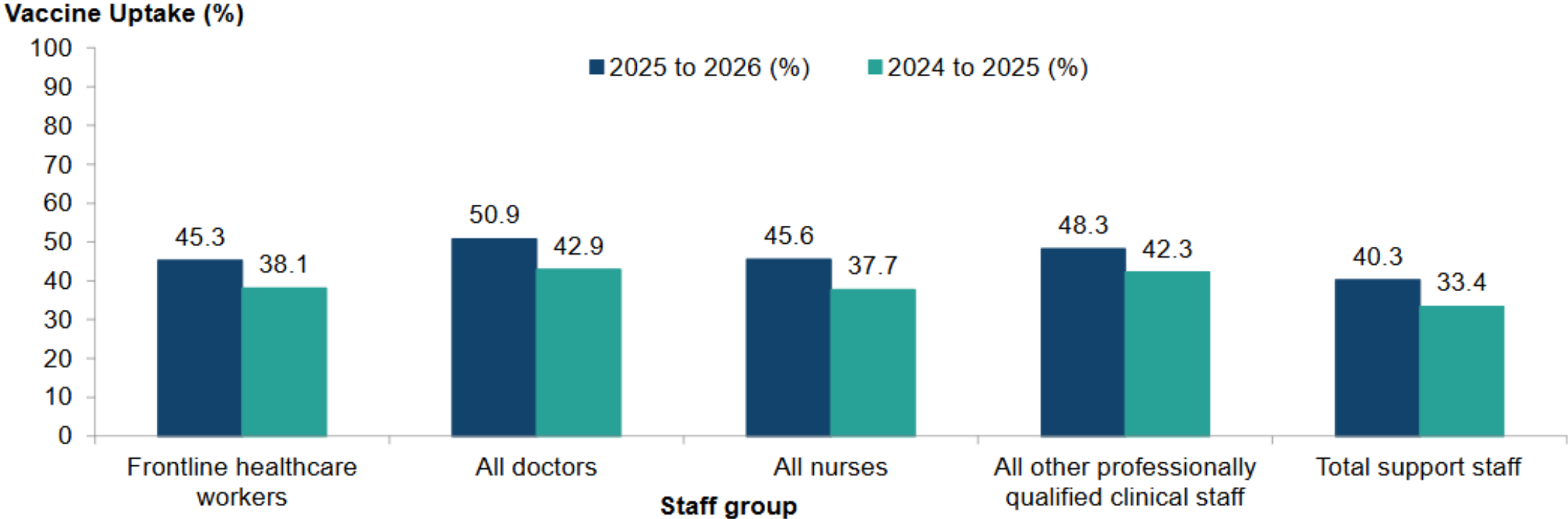


**Figure 1. Influenza vaccine uptake (%) in frontline healthcare workers, by organisation type**

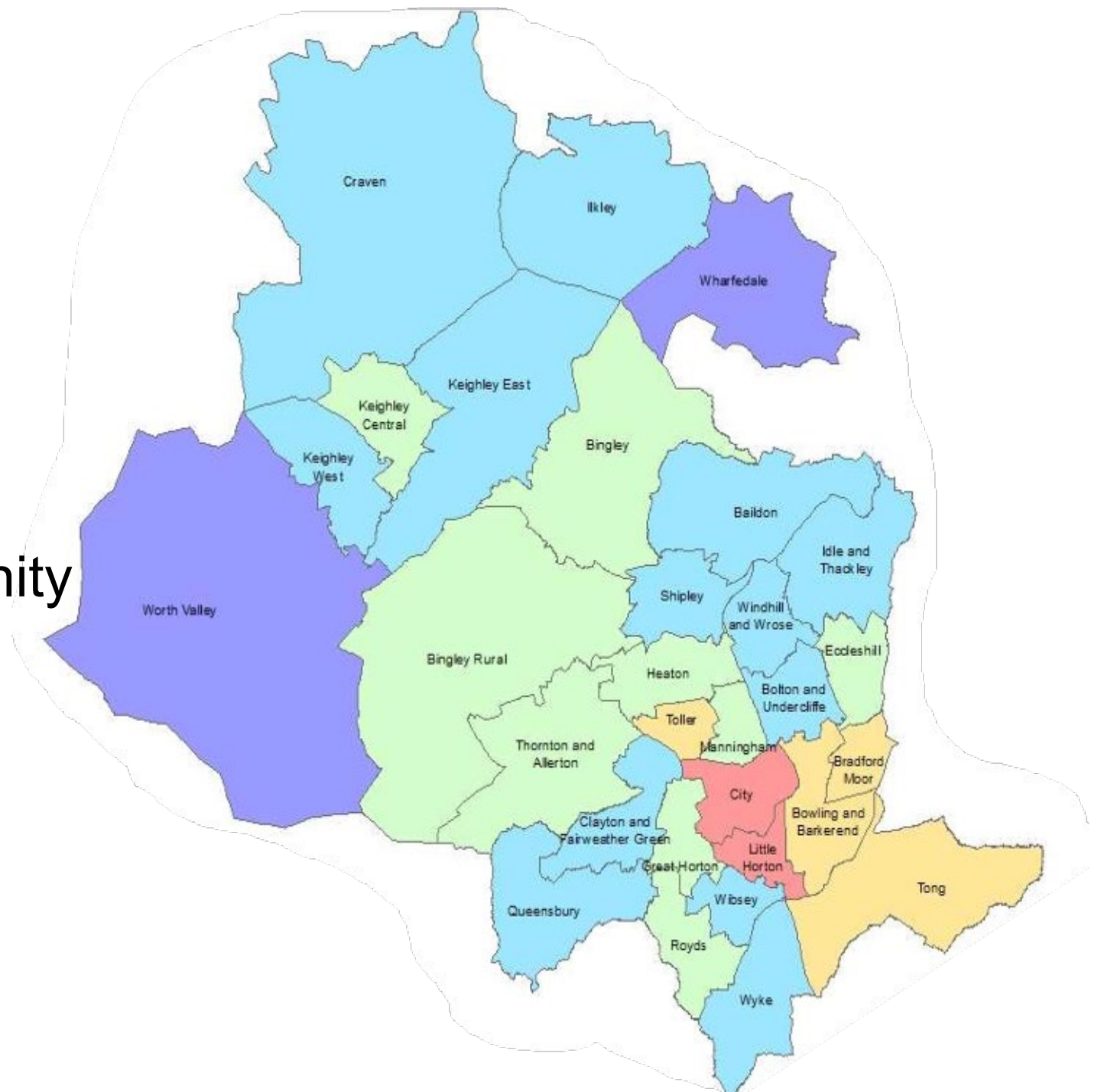

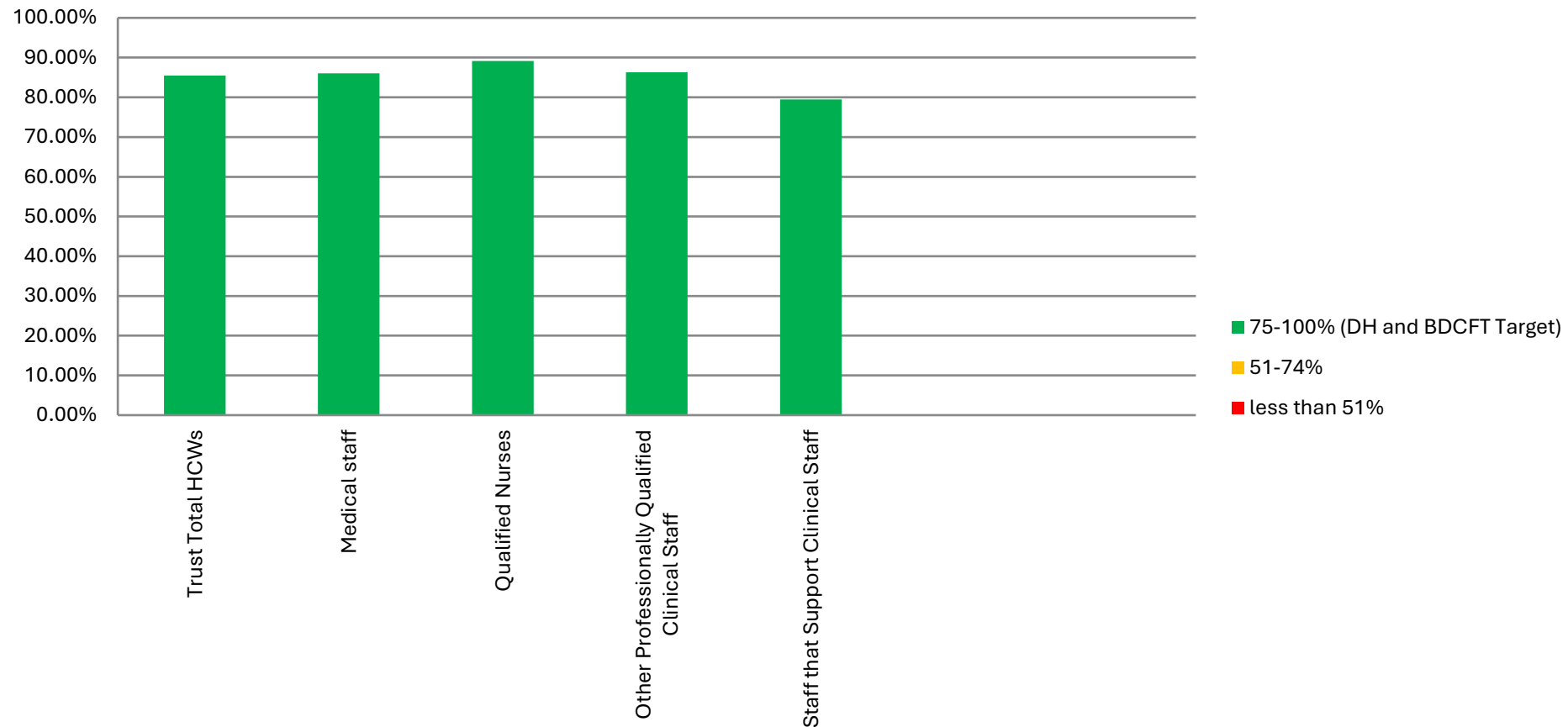
